For the full season, first went to Mel Willard, second went to Sharon Filary and third to Heather Aberdein.

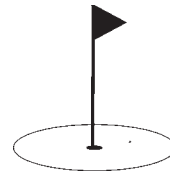
Improved score over last year; Sandy Ferris-70 strokes (1 birdie) and Barbara Witucki- 52 strokes (1 birdie).

Report?,... or not Report?

Did somebody rummage through your car that was left unlocked? Did somebody hit your mailbox with a bat? Did somebody paint something on your fence? If you answered "yes" to any of these or any similar type or variation of these questions, did you report it to your local law enforcement agency? If you answer with a "no", then you are doing you, your neighbors, and your community a disservice.

Why? Simple: #1 - You may have physical evidence that may help law enforcement identify and catch the subject who committed the crime. Although you think what happened is minor and may never be solved, what are the chances of stopping the bad guy if you do not report it? #2 - If a criminal commits crime and never gets pursued by law enforcement, where is the deterrent? #3 - How can you justify asking for more law enforcement officers or equipment to help them detect and catch criminals if there are no statistics to show there is a problem with crime in your community?

In short, a crime unreported is a crime that did not happen. If you don't take the time to report something, no matter how minor you think it is, then it did not happen. You may not have had anything taken out of your car but your neighbor may have lost thousands. If you have physical evidence in your car that could link a suspect to your neighbor's car, then it may help law enforcement not only catch the thief but maybe even recover the stolen property. So, please, take the time to report any crime, no matter how small you think it is, and avoid contaminating the area where the crime occurred.
