Manager's

Report

The Golf Lakes staff is pursuing completion of our summer goals and projects. The office staff has been doing a lot of organizing and updating in preparation of the upcoming busy season. The maintenance staff, though short one person, is keeping the park looking great and working on summer

projects. We are in hopes to have a new employee by time this article is published.

August will see the palm trees trimmed. If you have palms that the Association does not trim the contractor will do them for \$25.00 per tree. Just send the money to the Golf Lakes office and we will have the contractor do them. The vendor should begin mid-August so you can also call the office to get on the list and then send in the money.

I am making the final updates to the 2023 budget this month in preparation for review by the Budget and Finance Committee in September and the Board of Directors in October. The Board of Directors will vote on the Budget at the Budget Meeting the first Monday of December after it has been mailed or hand delivered to all residents. Residents are welcomed to ask questions after receiving their copy of the budget. The Board will discuss the budget in its entirety at the first Board Meeting in October and again at the Budget Meeting the first Monday in December.

Along with the summer rains the weeds are sprouting. Thank you to the residents who made arrangements to keep your property looking good all year long. Leaving a contact with the office prior to departing for your summer home saves time, phone calls and you from paying someone other than who you made arrangements with. The park inspections are accomplished monthly during the summer.

Winter residents thank you for your cooperation in putting things away prior to leaving for the summer in accordance with my Rule Reminder for this month. President Hooker and I did our annual inspection of the whole park and were very happy with the manner in which items were put away for the summer. Summer residents if you are leaving for more than 7 days please put things away. Also, all summer residents need to take time to evaluate the number of things outside that will have to be put away if an evacuation notice is given. Make it easy on yourself and put things away now or get rid of things if you don't think you can get them put away.

Residents requesting Florida Power and Light (FP&L) to restore power for them after Gate Street is closed need to make arrangements with FPL to get them into Golf Lakes. You may give them your code or last name and explain how they can use the phone system to enter the park. You may also meet them at Gate Street to let them in. FP&L does not have the capability of informing all crews of the access code like the Sheriff and Fire Department does.

I hope everyone is having a healthy and safe summer. We are having our typical hot and humid weather here.



Evidence of human use in the area of Glacier National Park dates back over 10,000 years. Several different tribes inhabited the area. The Blackfeet Indians controlled the vast prairies east of the mountains, while the Salish and Kootenai Indians lived in the western valleys, utilizing the area around and what is now the park for hunting, fishing, ceremonies, and gathering plants.

Today, the 1.5-million acre Blackfeet Indian Reservation, which shares Glacier's eastern border, is home to about 8,600 members of the Blackfeet Nation, the largest tribe in Montana. The Flathead Indian Reservation encompasses approximately 1.3 million acres along the Flathead River and is home to approximately 7,000 members of the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes of the Flathead Nation.

As early as the 1700s, explorers came in search of beaver and other pelts. They were soon followed by miners as well as settlers. By 1891, the completion of the Great Northern Railway sealed the area's fate, allowing a greater number of people to enter into the heart of northwest Montana and soon small towns developed.

"Far away in northwestern Montana, hidden from view by clustering mountain-peaks, lies an unmapped corner—the Crown of the Continent." When George Bird Grinnell first wrote those words, little did he know the impact they would have for future generations. Around the turn of the century, people started to look at the land differently...they began to recognize that the area had a unique scenic beauty all to its own. By the late 1800s, Grinnell along with Louis Hill, president of the Great Northern Railway, pushed for the creation of a national park. In 1910, their efforts were rewarded when President Taft signed the bill establishing Glacier as the country's 10th national park.

Glacier National Park is a showcase of melting glaciers, alpine meadows, carved valleys, and spectacular lakes. With over 700 miles of trails, Glacier is a paradise for adventurous visitors seeking wilderness steeped in human history. Relive the days of old through historic chalets, lodges, and the famous Going-to-the-Sun Road. The landscape gives inspiration to those persistent enough to venture through it. The park is open 24 hours a day 365 days of the year. An entrance fee is required.

The average temperatures in August are a high of 84° with a low of 47°, making Glacier a great place to cool off during the dog days of summer! Even the picture on our cover reflects the cool and refreshing atmosphere.

PROTECTING YOUR IDENTITY

Much of the information contained on this page comes from a 2018 booklet from LAW Publications and it is being shared in order to inform you of the numerous ways you can safeguard your identity.

WHAT IS YOUR IDENTITY

Your personal identity includes any data or information that can be used to distinguish you from any other person. Protecting your information and your identity is a must in today's world. This means safeguarding sensitive personal data and taking steps to protect your presence in the real world as well as your online presence.

Identity theft is the fraudulent use of your name and identifying data by someone else to obtain credit, merchandise, or services. Identity thieves use the information you exchange in your daily transactions (name, address, phone number, SSN, DOB) for their own ends, typically by digitally impersonating you online.

A few of the typical clues that someone has stolen your identity may include:

- > You have bank withdrawals you didn't make
- You do not receive routine billing in the mail
- Personal checks are refused
- > You get calls about debts that aren't yours
- > You find unfamiliar charges on your credit card
- > You are billed for services you didn't authorize
- You have problems filing medical claims

Sharing Personal Info

Reputable companies will strive to protect your personal information. Your best protection is to deal with established companies with a reputation for honesty. Before you deal with people or companies that are unknown to you, check them out thoroughly.

Before sharing any personal information:

- > Consider whether you have an alternate choice
- Confirm you are dealing with a legitimate company or organization – DO NOT click on a company link in an email but go instead to your internet search site and type in the company name, unfortunately, clicking on an email link may redirect you to a fraudulent site
- > Check the company website for scam alerts

Ways to Protect Your Identity

Here is a checklist of ways you can safeguard your personal identity:

- ✓ Establish passwords on your credit cards, bank, and phone accounts. Don't use any easily identifiable series of numbers or letters.
- Pay attention to billing cycles and contact creditors if bills do not arrive.
- Protect your deposit slips and checkbook. Don't use a deposit slip or blank check as a way to share your address or phone number.
- Refuse to give out information over the phone or internet to unsolicited calls to you no matter who they say they are.
- Guard your mail from theft. Deposit mail in PO collection boxes or at your local Post Office.
- Buy a shredder and use it on charge receipts, credit applications, insurance forms, statements, checks, and even expired charge cards.
- Have recurring checks direct deposited into you bank.
- ✓ Minimize the amount of identification and the number of debit/credit cards you carry. Only carry what you need and <u>never</u> carry your Social Security card.
- ✓ Secure personal information safely at all times and keep a list of information in case you need to report a lost or stolen credit card.
- ✓ Only give out your Social Security number when <u>absolutely</u> necessary and verify that it will be kept secure.

Security When Using an ATM

- Do not write your PIN number on the back of your debit card and always stand directly in front of the ATM when entering the number so that no one can look over your shoulder.
- Put away cash as soon as possible. Do not stand and count it or hold it in plain sight.
- Be ready to conduct your business as soon as it is your turn and remove your receipt when finished.
- Visit well-lighted ATMs and always be alert. You cannot be overly cautious.

And, Elsewhere

- Avoid allowing attendants or waiters disappear from view with your credit or debit card.
- Make sure no one is too close to you when using your debit or credit card. A quick photo by somebody may mean they can duplicate your card.

Much of the information contained on this page comes from a 2018 booklet from LAW Publications and it is being shared in order to inform you of ways to safeguard yourself from cyber crime.

YOUR COMPUTER AND NETWORKS

Cyber criminals can use computers to obtain sensitive information in numerous ways, including:

- <u>Hacking</u>: Access is obtained by sending compromised emails to the victim or building websites with malicious code. Once in your system, hackers can obtain your personal information by tracking your keystrokes.
- <u>Ransomware</u>: This is a type of malware that encrypts, or locks, valuable digital files and literally demands a ransom payment to release them. In a ransomware attack, victims open an email and may click on an attachment or link that appears legitimate. In reality, the attachment contains the ransomware code.

Ransomware attacks are becoming more sophisticated. In newer instances, cyber criminals aren't using emails and are now seeding legitimate websites with malicious codes. It is difficult to detect ransomware before it is too late.

- <u>Malware</u>: This is a malicious software loaded onto your computer without your knowledge. It includes different types of viruses such as 'trojan' and 'spyware' programs. Malware can affect your computer, tablet, or phone and is designed to steal credit card details and other personal information.
- <u>Pop-Up Ad Scams</u>: A scammer may trick you into giving out personal details online by using a pop-up ad claiming you are a winner. You'll never receive anything except unauthorized transactions appearing in your bank account.
- <u>Phishing Scams</u>: These are attempts by scammers to trick you into giving out your personal information. They will contact you out of the blue via email, text, phone, or even social media. They may ask you to update personal information or fill out a survey or even tell you that there has been 'unauthorized or suspicious activity' on your account.
- Eavesdropping & Surveillance: The most common way to eavesdrop is a wiretap or the practice of connecting a listening device to communication channels. As new technologies are introduced, computers as well as phones can now be hacked for eavesdropping or surveillance.
- <u>Salami Slicing Attack</u>: This is a technique used by cyber criminals to steal money or resources a tiny bit at a time so it isn't noticeable immediately.

WHAT TO DO ABOUT CYBER CRIME

Cyber crime prevention can be difficult, but here are some simple steps you can take:

- Keep your computer updated with the latest antivirus software
- Keep an eye on the security configuration settings of your computer
- Select strong passwords and keep them safe
- Defend your computer with security software
- Maintain your computer hardware in a secure location

SOCIAL NETWORKING

Social networking has become an important part of life for not only teens and young adults but seniors as well. With all the benefits, it is easy to overlook the risks, including hacking. To make the best use of social networking and avoid risks, users should follow basic safety tips.

- <u>Be Cautious of Sharing Too Much</u>: Some facts can reveal too much about you and you should make sure that you keep your personal information private. Think twice about what you post.
- <u>Adjust Privacy Settings</u>: Altering your privacy settings can allow you to block strangers and people who are not friends from viewing private information and limit the information available in search results.
- <u>Verify Whom You're Connecting With</u>: Questionable accounts may be set up in an effort to misrepresent another person with false statements. The goal may be to embarrass or create problems. If you are uncertain of the authenticity of an account, it is important to verify the contents.
- <u>Be Aware of Impersonators</u>: Impersonation can be a problem when it comes to comments on networking sites. Some sites are now requiring commenters to go through an authentication process. That is not the case with all sites. If somebody is using your name or photo, most sites will allow you to flag those posts as fraudulent.
- <u>Be Careful of Over-Friending</u>: A high number of friends is not always positive. Don't accept a friend request from someone you don't know personally, and consider adjusting your privacy setting to limit access to sensitive or private posts to a limited number of contacts. Lastly, learn how to block "unfriendly" followers from unwanted contact.




SOCIAL HOUR INVITATION

How to Protect Yourself From the Most Clever Cons

Much of the information contained on this page comes from a 2018 booklet from LAW Publications and it is being shared in order to alert you to cons, frauds, and scams designed to take your money.

There are many scammers out there determined to cut to the chase and take your money directly. Knowing what scams are out there and how the scammers operate is key to protecting yourself.

STREET CONS

Street cons rarely turn violent. Con artists are experts at persuading victims to willingly give up their possessions or money. These cons tend to focus on the victim's desire to help someone in need.

- <u>The Corner Homeless</u>: Yes, there are those out there who are legitimately homeless and in need of help. However, there are many who simply prefer to beg rather than work. Never give them cash. If you feel like helping them, keep a box of peanut butter crackers in the car and hand them out.
- <u>Home Improvement Scams</u>: These scams usually involve an unknown repairman who informs the victim of needed repairs. The 'repairman' then asks for payment before completing the job. Be skeptical of:
 - uninvited salesmen or an unsolicited claim of needed home improvements
 - > anyone asking you to authorize a credit check
 - being rushed into signing a contract
 - being asked to sign a blank contract

TELEPHONE AN ONLINE SCAMS

Telephone scammers usually seem friendly but will say anything to cheat you out of money. They may call you by your first name or ask you about a recent purchase. They may even seem legitimate.

- <u>Investigator Scam</u>: The fake investigator states that legal action or a lawsuit is pending against you but it could be avoided by paying a small fee. The 'investigator' then asks for your personal and credit card information.
- <u>IRS Scams</u>: Sophisticated scammers pretend to be IRS collection officers over the phone. IRS will not call you direct. They normally communicate through mail delivered by the USPS. They will not demand payment or threaten arrest.
- <u>Online Giving Portals</u>: These types of accounts have grown in popularity. They make it quick and easy to donate but your donation may not entirely go to the charity of choice. Many portals may keep a percentage. The best online portals will state whether there are any fees as well as how long it will take the charity to receive your donation.

- Police/Firefighter Fundraising Calls: Yes, we want to support our first responders but they normally do not call to solicit money. To safeguard yourself about any such calls, always request that they send you the information about their organization in writing. If they have your phone number, they should have your address as well – do not give it to them. And, don't feel intimidated about declining to give.
- Obituary Scams: Obituary scams take different forms but they all involve preying upon the grieving. They can be as simple as selling Bibles and religious items or providing services claimed to have been authorized by the deceased. Many times persons coming to your home may ask to use the restroom and take that opportunity to rob. It is more frequent now to find that obituaries are rather vague with personal information, often eliminating the possibility of a scammer coming to the home of the deceased.
- <u>Investment Scams</u>: Con artists will often claim false affiliations with legitimate banking institutions and business organizations. Prospective investors are tricked into believing that they are part of an innovative program and are often asked to sign non-disclosure agreements.
- <u>Sweepstakes/Contest Scams</u>: You are conned into entering contests with a simply puzzle or entry form and a small fee to go to the next level. Then the process is repeated. Many victims invest thousands of dollars in this manner.



Knowing what scams are out there and how the scammers operate is key to protecting yourself. Always consider your options.

Rule of Thumb: If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!
