Here are a few tips to protect yourself and others while navigating within Golf Lakes Estates and outside the gates:

- When turning, DO NOT cut your corners short. There
  may be a cart, auto or pedestrian approaching the
  intersection (or parked on the curb).
- When approaching any intersection, come to a full stop before proceeding. Golf carts included.
- ALWAYS walk facing traffic. NEVER walk with your back to traffic.
- Bicyclists are to follow all traffic rules as if you're driving a golf cart or auto.
- When walking at night, always walk with a flashlight or other lighting method. Wear reflective or high visibility clothing.
- If you must travel at night outside the gates, be very wary of bicyclists and pedestrians. Many have no lights and wear dark clothing. We live in and conduct much of our business in unincorporated Manatee County which means fewer sidewalks and bike lanes. Also, many of our cars have tinted windows which adds to the difficulty in spotting others. Stay alert!
- When using your cart at night, turn on your lights.
   This may seem like common sense, but it is forgotten frequently.
- If a resident asks you to turn on your car/cart lights, to slow down, etc., please do so without comment and comply.
- The 53<sup>rd</sup> Street gate is only to be used for exiting the park and RIGHT TURNS ONLY. Do not attempt to turn left (east) on to 53<sup>rd</sup> Street (SR 70).
- Please follow the in/out signs for the clubhouse parking lot. This includes golf carts.
- DO NOT park behind or near another resident's driveway especially on the cul-de-sacs and narrower streets. It makes it very difficult to not only back out of one's driveway but to enter. It also could hamper first responder access. Most cul-de-sacs have parking at the end. Please use those spaces.

#### FINALLY, THE SPEED LIMIT IN THE PARK IS 15 MPH.

Some Christmas holiday decorations are up. Thank you again to the Beautification Committee. Thanks also to the Hall Decorating Committee and Golf Lakes' Maintenance Staff for the lovely holiday look they create every year.

Spectrum's phone number is 1-833-697-7328. For our winter residents, I would suggest you call and get an appointment prior to coming to Florida if you are in need of service hook up. I am sure at some point they will be weeks out to install new service.

The Association has added Robo calls in addition to email blast as a way to communicate with residents. If you wish to be included in either way of communication, please be sure the office has your current email address and phone number on file. If you are giving the office your cell number be sure that you put Golf Lakes Office 941-755-3322 as a contact so you will know that it is Golf Lakes when the call goes out. If you do not get the message the first time wait and it will play again when you answer the phone. The pause is a little wait.

The Annual Budget Meeting is scheduled for Monday, December 5<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM. This will be a Zoom and in person meeting and you can get the information to join through the e-blast that will be going out or call the office for the information. The budget will be reviewed in its entirety; each line item will be explained and discussed. Please make this a priority and arrange your schedule so you can attend this important meeting. Following the Budget Meeting the Monthly Communication Meeting will be held. These meetings are always informative and will help you keep up on the business of your Association.

You will receive your coupon booklet for the 2022 maintenance fees after the 2022 Budget is passed by the Board of Directors. Coupon booklets are only sent to those not having auto debit. Auto debit customers will receive a letter. Maintenance fees are due January 1, 2023. The coupon booklets are printed from the Association's bank. There are three ways to make your payment.

- Payment by check Use available address label to mail directly to the bank. The address labels are attached to the coupon where you tear it out of the booklet.
- Automatic Debit There will be a form included with the coupons to enroll in Automatic Debit.
- Online Bill Payment Set up your payment using the payment account number (found on the coupon). The payee will still be Golf Lakes and mailed to the Association's bank. There is a letter enclosed with the coupons to give you directions.

Traffic has also increased considerably, for your safety and the safety of others, do not make a left turn out of the entrance on to 53<sup>rd</sup> Avenue. Also, please, the speed limit in the park is 15 mph, your cooperation is very much appreciated. There are so many bike riders and walkers this time of year so please cruise slowly through your park.

Yard lights are now \$94.07. If you do not currently have a yard light, please consider getting one as they help with the lighting of the whole park. A different yard light is also allowed. If you just need the globe, they are available for \$22.40.

Anyone wanting to make a donation to the clubhouse must contact the office. Please do not just leave items in clubhouse. By contacting the office, we can put you in contact with the proper person. For larger items the Board of Directors has to approve all items that the Association will be responsible to maintain in the future.





Each year there are three Board of Directors positions that are up for election. Any resident of Golf Lakes is eligible to run and be elected to those positions. If you are interested, it is very easy to apply:

- Fill out an Application for a Board of Directors position, which may be picked up in the main office beginning in October.
- Write up a short resume or information sheet on yourself (1 page). Enclose a photo (a Walgreens passport photo works well). Be sure to leave room on your resume page to attach your photo.
- Return the Application, Resume and photo to the office.

General elections are held in February each year. If you are willing to represent the residents of Golf Lakes, this is your opportunity to participate in the operation and financial decisions that are required to make Golf Lakes the great community that it is.

THE STETSON MANSION, c. 2005

Two renovators from south Florida were looking for a beach house in 2005 and stumbled upon an online video of a 19<sup>th</sup> century Victorian mansion filled with rich architectural details. They found the long forgotten mansion (see photo above) with a dirt driveway behind a chain link fence on an overgrown lot. It had barely been touched in over 100 years.

JT and Michael (who approved this article) purchased the private estate and then proceeded to restore and update the mansion, school house, and green house as well as build a new carriage house. Instead of relying on grants or taxpayer subsidies to restore this historic treasure, they decided to pursue an unusual concept. They began asking longtime acquaintances to perfect strangers if they would like to participate in a showcase in which they could display their products, their designs and/or their artistic skills. All the proceeds from the original two-month Renovation Showcase Tours were donated to the DeLand Museum of Art.

The Stetson Mansion is regarded as one of America's top 300 historic homes, an obvious point of pride for its new owners. It is Florida's first luxury estate, built in 1886 for famed hat maker and Florida's first snowbird, John B. Stetson. The Mansion is the largest (at just under 10,000 sq. ft.), grandest, and most historic home ever built in Florida before the 20th century. It was the first home in Florida designed and constructed with Edison electricity, steam heat, indoor plumbing and a call bell system. Opulent details include 16 different mosaic parquet wood floor patterns, 10,000 panes of antique glass and various handmade wood embellishments.

Voted one of *USA Today's* top ten historic home displays, the Christmas Tours *(cover photo)* at the Mansion are offered Nov. 1 to Jan. 22, by advance reservation. The "Christmas Spectacular!" is different every year and geared for a mature audience. The Victorians started our modern Christmas traditions like gift giving and Christmas trees, so what's better than seeing Christmas in one of the Victorian homes where it all started? The Stetson Mansion had one of the first trees ever illuminated with electric lights. That's what you got when you knew Thomas Edison!

<u>Guided</u> Historic Tours are offered <u>by reservation only</u> between February and mid-July and guests will learn the history of the Mansion, the Stetsons, and hear the story of the new owners who saved it.

The Stetson Mansion may be Florida's most historic home, but it is not a museum. It is a private residence that is lived in and welcomes guests throughout the year. Photographs are not allowed within the home.






