

According to the International Association of Fire and Rescue Services, lithium-ion battery (LIB) fires have increased five-fold since 2016. With the advent of electric cars, cell phones and more recently e-bikes and escooters, many opportunities for LIB fires are present in everyday life. Here are a few tips to help mitigate potential incidents:

- Always use the original charger •
- Never leave batteries near combustible materials
- Never leave batteries unattended while charging
- Never try to charge a deformed or damaged battery
- Discard damaged batteries at an authorized recycle center. Never throw in your regular trash.
- Charge large items like e-bikes or e-scooters outside or in well ventilated areas

Take an inventory of items in your home that may have LIBs. These include cell phones, laptops, tablets, e-book readers, headphones, digital cameras, game controllers and smart watches.

Speaking of fires, a few items to consider:

- When was the last time you tested your smoke alarms and/or changed the batteries?
- Do you have a fire extinguisher in your home, shed, etc.
- Can you locate your fire extinguishers?
- If you can, are they still charged, up to date and ready for use?
- If you have an older home, is your secondary exit door available and working?
- Do you have a plan in case of a fire? IF IN DOUBT, CHECK IT OUT! Submitted by Harry Mathos, Safety Committee

Happy New Year!! This month I will celebrate my 35<sup>th</sup> year working for Golf Lakes, first as a part-time secretary/bookkeeper, then your office manager and then in 1999 your property manager and broker. It has been a true pleasure working for you and I appreciate the opportunities Golf Lakes has given to me.

The January Communication Meeting and Board Candidates Introductions will be Monday, January 9, 2023 due to how the holidays fall.

Along with the New Year is a new quarter; you are reminded maintenance fees are due again. You should have received your new payment coupons by now. Options for payment are listed in the letter accompanying your coupons. Please use them as they assist with tracking your payments. If you are not on auto debit and have not received the coupons, please contact the office staff. Auto debit residents should have received just a letter. Please consider making your payment with Auto Debit as it reduces the fees for the Association.

The **Annual Meeting** will be Monday, February 13, 2023 at 7:00 P.M. Votes will <u>not</u> be accepted after 7:00 P.M. on the 13<sup>th</sup>. The election packets will be handed out after January 6<sup>th</sup>, so please pick yours up to save on postage cost. Due to the meeting being in person and zoom, this year the Association is asking all unit owners to mail in their proxies, the proxy will only be used for a quorum. There must be a quorum (391 units) represented by proxy to call the meeting to order. <u>Residents must sign their blue</u> <u>ballot or they will not be counted.</u>

Garbage and yard trash days are Tuesday and Friday. Be sure to have your trash out early as it takes all day to do the whole park. Yard trash has to be in clear bags sold at the office, your household trash will not be picked up if it has yard trash in it. This prevents the yard trash going into the compactor which is not allowed by the county. Also, please keep all items to 40 pounds in weight. Please do not leave your trash in the common areas. Trash other than household trash will only be picked up the third Tuesday of every month. According to the rule, residents will have to pay for this service. You will need to contact the office to give your address and the item(s) for pick up. There will be a price sheet available at the office and is published in this Banner periodically. You will need to pay cash or check to the office prior to the items being picked up.

The mowing in the non-growing season, November thru April, is every other week. If you have any complaints or suggestions please contact the office. Do not approach the mowing crew. There will be a supervisor on sight and hopefully all issues can be resolved quickly and to your satisfaction. A form is available at the office for any damage you think has been done by the lawn mowing crew.

You are encouraged to inspect the outside of your home, especially awnings and carport roofs for dirt and mildew; they may need to be washed and/or painted. It is important that residents accomplish housekeeping tasks while living in Golf Lakes to prevent maintenance during the summer while you are gone. If you or your guest park in the north parking lot and park a vehicle in front of the golf course tee, be sure there is ample room for the golfers to swing their club without hitting the vehicle. Also, be sure your name and phone number is on the vehicle so someone can be contacted to move it if necessary.

Occasionally, anonymous letters to the Board of Directors and Manager are received. Please reconsider sending anonymous letters as most of the time an explanation needs to be made and without contact information, the matter goes un-resolved. The Board and I do understand the need to have things brought to our attention and appreciate member's ideas and input.

#### **RULE REMINDER**

VI. 5.

All clotheslines must be the folding tree type and must be placed in the rear or at the side of the mobile home.

When not in use, clotheslines must be taken down and put inside.

No clothes shall be hung on unenclosed carports or patios.

No clothes shall be dried outside on Sunday.

Once there were 112 beautiful acres with pastures, giant Oak Trees, Australian Pines, Coconut Palms and Bahia Grass where the local cattle and horses of Bradenton grazed.

The 60's Post War Era in Florida was booming with possibilities and two men had a vision of taking three lonely homes (see cover photo) and this waterlogged land to create a grand mobile home park. They asked 7 others to join in their new adventure and decided Mr. Lynn Gilmore would be the managing developer of the park.

Golf Lakes was to be built in five phases with wide streets, avenues and cul-de-sacs, over a six-year period. Of course, the low-lying land needed extra fill dirt, roads, electricity, plumbing and more. The work started out slowly and was very costly.

Phase One construction started in 1965 consisting of a small office recreation center which had stones from North Carolina and eight shuffleboard courts with a putting green in front of the clubhouse. The first residents, Mr. & Mrs. Harry Immel from New York moved in on February 1, 1965 and were joined by three other residents who waited patiently for the rest of their new neighbors to come.

By the end of January 1966 there were 61 occupied lots with the South and North Sections being built out along with a beautiful new bridge. Lot rental rates started out at \$300 and up to \$550 per year depending on locations, sizes, or lakefront. Free palm trees were being provided.

Phase Two encompassed the design and construction of the Golf Course which became an attractive focal point for potential new buyers.


Phases Three through Five saw many new homes brought into the park and Golf Lakes became "the" mecca for mobile home enthusiasts with an expanded 8,000 sq. ft. Recreation Center, many activities and conveniences, as well as a Promise of Paradise. All was completed by 1970.



#### NEW HOME PLACEMENT COMMITTEE REMINDER

One mandate of the New Home Placement Committee is that we are responsible, along with the Park Manager, for determining that modifications to the exterior of existing homes shall comply with the rules as set forth by the Board of Directors. No construction of any new structure or additions to existing structures, or any painting, is to commence prior to submitting drawings and specifications to the Manager and obtaining written approval to proceed with the construction.

Regulations are in place concerning paint colors. Our committee modified the acceptable colors, and these were approved by your Board of Directors earlier this year. If you are planning to repaint, please check to be sure your color is still on the approved list. Samples of approved colors can be obtained in the Golf Lakes Office. #### PROTECT YOUR PIPES (AND YOUR POCKETBOOK)

One of the most overlooked aspects of home ownership is the sewer pipe (lateral) that runs beneath your home to the sewer system. This lateral is typically 4 inches in diameter and made of cast iron or PVC. Sewer laterals are designed to carry food waste, laundry discharge, and toilet paper/waste from your home to the gravity sewer system, pump stations, wastewater treatment facility and ultimately our surface waters, golf courses and county fire suppression hydrants. It is critical that we allow only the above stated products to be discharged to the system. Products not allowed include:

- Flushable wipes. Yes, they are "flushable" and that is the problem. These wipes are significantly stronger than toilet paper and do not break down once flushed. In fact, they will eventually form a large ball plugging pumps and clogging sewers. They are to be disposed of in your regular garbage. I cannot stress this strong enough: DO NOT FLUSH FLUSHABLE WIPES!!
- If you cook meals that generate any amount of grease, do not dispose of grease down the sink. It will congeal and eventually plug your sewer lateral. Dump the grease in a disposable aluminum foil pan with a bit of cat litter. The cat litter will absorb the grease making disposal in your regular garbage easy-peasy.
- If your home has the original cast iron P-trap connection to your lateral, consider being proactive and replace with PVC or other modern material. Chances are if your trap is made of cast iron, the opening to allow waste to leave could be the size of a quarter instead of 4 inches. Cast iron corrodes over time reducing the inside diameter of the pipe.
- Do not flush prescription drugs and over-thecounter drugs down the toilet. Wastewater facilities are not designed to remove these contaminants and they will pass through, thereby contaminating aquatic life. For disposal options, go to https://drugfreemanatee.org
- Do not flush cloth or disposable diapers down the toilet.

A little common sense will go a long way when protecting your home's sewer disposal system. Think before it goes down the sink!

- Milk, water and juice cartons




