

As I write this and look forward to September, I am reminded the end of summer is quickly approaching and soon another season will begin. This month the staff will be finishing summer projects and completing final touch-ups as we prepare for another season. Typically, we begin to see our winter residents returning this month.

Several of our residents leave keys to their units in their files at the office. If you are a single individual please consider leaving a key in your file. If there is a need to check to be sure you are okay it simplifies the process.

Our summer rains are now here and everything is growing well including weeds. I complete a park inspection of the park every month and there are several places that need weeding. If you are in the park, please take a walk around your unit and check for weeds. If you are not in the park please have someone check your home if you did not make prior arrangements.

Contracts to sign up for the park lawn mowing program will be mailed soon. These are annual contracts and must be signed and returned **every year** or you will **not** be on the park lawn mowing. If you desire to participate in this program, contracts need to be signed and returned to the office no later than **November 1, 2022.** Due to billing requirements, there will be <u>no exceptions to this</u> <u>deadline</u>. You many include them in your October quarterly payment if you don't send it to the bank but to the office.

Also, with the contract there will be a survey which needs to be completed every few years. It is the Verification of Resident's Age Survey. Each owner/occupant (not guest) must be listed with their birthdates.

The Realty office has had interest in sales this summer. There have been 3 closings in May, 1 in June, 2 in July and 1 pending closing for August. If you have a need to sell your unit please contact Lynne at Golf Lakes Realty for a market opinion.

RULE REMINDER

VI. The Mobile Home Site

- Members are responsible for the overall appearance of the mobile site. Sites shall be kept orderly, neat, clean and free of litter. Watering, weeding, replacement of lawn by sod, grass seed, plugs, mulch or stones and general care of the lawn, planters, shrubs and trees are the responsibility of the member. No lawn shall be mowed before 7:30 a.m. or on Sunday.
- Mobile homes shall be attractively maintained and comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, and regulations of state, county or Park, as from time to time are amended.
- Mobile home sites not maintained to standards to the Association will be maintained by the Association. A minimum fee of \$50.00 will be charged to the member for each service performed.

Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse

This lighthouse was built in Mackinaw City, Michigan in 1892 to replace the 1869 McGulpin Point Lighthouse, which was located two miles farther west but not visible in all directions. A fog signal had been put in place 2 years earlier, in a building which was torn down around 1940 and later reconstructed to house the Straits of Mackinac Shipwreck Museum.

When in operation, Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse housed the families of a lighthouse keeper and an assistant keeper in separate apartments. The families of the keepers assisted with tasks such as hauling oil to the lantern room at the top of the 50' tower. That oil lamp was replaced by an electric light in 1929.

A radio beacon was added to the Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse in 1937. It was installed in the same building as the fog horn. In the 1930s, the original steam whistles were replaced with air horns which took much less work to maintain.

Each lighthouse in a region is unique, giving navigators more cues as to which navigational aid they are seeing or hearing. Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse was constructed from Indiana limestone, giving it an attractive castle like appearance. The light was a revolving, fourth order Fresnel lens which gave a red flash every ten seconds. The fog whistles also had their own pattern, with a 5 second blast, 17 seconds of silence, another 5 second blast, and 33 seconds of silence, repeated once a minute.

This lighthouse is opposite the turning point for ships making the difficult passage through the Straits of Mackinac, one of the busiest crossroads of the Great Lakes. Its light was visible to ships 16 miles away.

Old Mackinac Point Lighthouse remained in operation until 1957, when the lights on the nearby Mackinac Bridge made the navigational aid no longer necessary. Today the lighthouse is part of the Mackinac State Historic Parks.

There's just as much to see from the top of the tower as inside the original buildings. Authentically restored quarters and exhibits, including the original lens, a movie, *Shipwrecks of the Straits*, and the Straits of Mackinac Shipwreck Museum make this "Castle of the Straits" a true gem of the Great Lakes. Lighthouse and museum are open early May to early October.

A truly unique shopping experience is inside the Fog Signal Building, built in 1906. Nautical-themed apparel, shipwreck-inspired items and original publications make this museum store a can't-miss spot in Mackinaw City.

As you prepare for your return to Golf Lakes don't forget about the Night of Music coming up in March. This year's theme is "Life's Like a Box of Chocolates." The Night of Music is our committee's only fundraiser. Be thinking now about how YOU can be a part of the fun. The directors will be anxious to hear your ideas. In addition to acts, there is always a need for residents to help behind the scenes.

Our first committee meeting will be November 9 at 10:30 in the Board Room. All Golf Lakes residents are welcome to attend.



Things to Do and Ways to Enjoy Yourself








SOCIAL HOUR SHORT ANNOUNCEMENTS
