For clarification, here is the <u>**new rule**</u> concerning alcoholic beverages in the common areas:

- No sponsor, committee or individual shall sell, provide or pour alcohol to any individuals. (NO POUR RULE)
- Individuals will provide their own alcohol to be consumed at the function (BYOB)
- The event sponsor/requesting group shall have the responsibility to monitor the function for anti-social behavior.
- Drunken or offensive behavior shall not be tolerated.

The annual meeting requires a lot of work on behalf of the Board, staff and volunteers. I want to thank everyone who contributed to another successful annual meeting. As a reminder, state law requires a certain number of unit owners vote on the blue ballot and election. It is important that you participate in this process or all the work is for nothing.

Golf Lakes is a "No Pet" community. The animals in the park are approved under the Federal Fair Housing Law. No resident or guest may have an animal in the park without first being approved by the attorney through the Manager.

I am sure all residents are enjoying the Florida sunshine and the spring weather. Usually, this time of year there are a lot of guests coming to share our beautiful weather. Residents are responsible for their guests. Be sure your guests are aware of and follow the rules. All rules are in your park directory.

On **Thursday, March 23rd** there will be a **SPRING CLEAN UP DAY** at Golf Lakes. The vendor who picks up your trash items will pick up anything (other than hazardous waste) that is put out at the curb free of charge. The Association is hopeful that residents will get rid of items stored outside that have potential to blow in a wind storm. Please take advantage of this free pickup and do a spring cleaning. Trash days are Tuesday and Friday at your home. Yard waste may not be combined with household garbage. Yard waste cannot be put in the compactor with household garbage. Do not bring garbage to the barn area or recycling area. It is not the job of your maintenance staff to service the residents' garbage needs.

The Association hopes to replace poles and backboards on the electrical system for your homes again this summer. The county is getting stricter on allowing older disconnects to be reconnected to the new backboards. I would suggest that owners check their disconnects, so if you get a letter that your backboard is being replaced you will be able to make a decision about your disconnect. Also, don't forget to be sure your address is on the breaker box on the backboard. This will be helpful in case of an emergency.

The Association has the palm trees trimmed in the common area and along the roads in August. If you have a palm tree on your property and would like it trimmed at that time the cost is \$30.00 per tree (only palm trees). You can bring the money to the Park Office and we will sign you up. If a tree is diseased along the roads it is removed as quickly

as possible to prevent spreading of any disease. The stump will be ground as soon as 6 or more are available.

The **Rule Reminder** for this month is the rule pertaining to putting items away before leaving for an extended time. Stacks of concrete cannot be left during the hurricane season, please get rid of them or put them inside. This includes blocks or sticks with string to block your driveway from use. **PLEASE COMPLY.** The other **Rule Reminder** is concerning outside plastic storage sheds which are no longer allowed in Golf Lakes. The Association has a list of current residents with these plastic storage sheds and no others will be allowed.

Top soil is available to residents at the recycle center. Do not take the soil under the cover next to the equipment shed. This is special soil that is only for the golf course and please do not dump old dirt in this soil.

Don't forget the clubhouse parking is a one-way entrance and one way exit. Please do your best to keep the clubhouse parking as safe as possible. Also, golf carts should <u>NOT</u> park in car spaces at the pool parking. There is not enough car parking this time of year. Additional golf cart parking can park along the pool fence in the grass.

Notary service is available free of charge to our residents at the office. Please do not sign the document until in front of the notary. For your convenience, you might want to check with the office to be sure that a notary is available and any witnesses you might need.

Some residents may be leaving this month to head to their summer homes. Don't forget to sign out at the office and provide the name of the person who is responsible for the yard work including planters and flower beds in your absence. Also, please take a walk around outside your unit before you leave to prevent getting a letter in the summer. Please take care of any mildew on your unit especially awnings.

### RULE REMINDERS

### VII. 16.

 All residents who will be gone for more than 7 days must shut off water supply to the mobile home. (It is highly advised to turn off electrical hot water heaters)
 All residents who will be away any time, for more than 7

days, during official hurricane season (June 1<sup>st</sup> to November 30<sup>th</sup>), must stow away all outdoor objects prior to leaving. This includes, but not limited to flower pots, grills, decorative statues, outdoor furniture, garbage cans, bicycles and rain barrels. <u>If not stored properly or</u> <u>anchored permanently all such items will be removed.</u> If an expense is incurred it will be charged to the owner.

### VIII. 14.

Utility Rooms/Sheds must be of conventional construction and must meet all setback requirements and if at all possible are to be extensions of existing structures. Standalone sheds such as Rubbermaid or sheds made of vinyl, plastic or any flexible material are not to be used. Any existing stand-alone sheds/storage units, shall be securely anchored to the ground as approved by the Manager. However; when the property changes hands the sheds/storage unit made of vinyl, plastic, or any flexible materials must be removed.

### The Building Blocks of Our Community Cover Story

### **The Banner**

The first issue of The Banner was in March 1968. Marion Scott and Edna Jones were writing a short newsletter discussing the park's activities and distributing them on their bicycles. After a few years they decided to make an official printed Banner and Bill Sams was our first editor. Many editors have followed, and as the park grew our banners were hand folded, distributed to volunteer delivery members, and mailed to snowbirds that left stamped envelopes. Now we have a committee who gathers all our activities and events, including scores, news and upcoming dates for calendars, plus photos at events. We have a more advanced printing & delivery process with lots of volunteers.

### **Our Park Emblem & Flag**

Guy Johnson suggested to Lynn Gilmore that we should have an emblem or crest in the park colors for park stationary and a flag. He proposed a *design contest* which would also provide a small sum of money and Lynn Gilmore matched it. The winning design was submitted by Glenn Miller. Currently we enjoy the plaque with our park crest on the front of the building. Guy then paid for a flag which was created in Columbus, Ohio and presented at a special ceremony in the fall of 1969. It currently flies proudly for all to see.

### **Our Song**

Around the same time our Emblem was created another contest for our *Golf Lakes Song* was sponsored by Lynn Gilmore. Anna Barna was the original writer and Charles Perry composed the music. The \$50 prize money was provided by Lynn Gilmore and Guy Johnson. We now sing the song during Saturday morning social hour and other fellowship activities.

### **Our Lakes**

Have you ever fished in one of our four lakes? Until 1975 they were nameless and Lynn Gilmore decided to hold a *name-the-lake contest* and installed four handpainted signs near each. The winning entries were submitted by: Henry Foerst, George Oborn, R. C. Ward and Main Stites.

Welcome Lake is closest to the entrance at 53<sup>rd</sup>. Pelican Lake is located at the north parking lot. Mirror Lake is located between 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Street. Golf View Lake is next to Heather Hills Golf Club.

What do the orangutans of Borneo, the elephants of Sumatra, and the Black Rhino all have in common? Aside from all being totally cool animals that we watch on YouTube, the more sobering truth about these creatures is that they're all critically endangered species. But on *World Wildlife Day*, the UN and its partners are planning to raise awareness of the gravity of this dire situation.

An animal is only placed on the critically endangered species list if the International Union for Conservation of Nature believes the animal faces a very high risk for extinction – extinction as in going the way of the dinosaurs and dodo. So what does critically endangered look like? Current estimates put the number of living Black Rhinos at around 2,500 in the entire world. Russia's Amur Leopard, found in the far eastern recesses of the country, is on the verge of extinction, with only about 40 left in the world. Unfortunately, this list goes on and on.

To raise awareness of endangered species and what we all can do, the UN is celebrating *World Wildlife Day* on **March 3**, marking the day the group signed the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora. <u>nationaltoday.com/march-holidays/worldwildlifeday</u>


