

The Annual Meeting will be Monday, February 13, 2023 at 7:00 PM. Votes will not be accepted after 7:00 PM. on the 13th. You may turn in your election items at the office when it is convenient for you. A quorum must be obtained to have the meeting. Please be sure to fill out and sign the proxy and turn in to the office

as soon as possible. Residents must sign their blue sheet and the self-addressed white envelope or they will not be counted.

I want to express my appreciation to last year's Board of Directors for all their work and help. I would like to acknowledge the service of Gerry DeJong and Connie Geth to Golf Lakes Board of Directors as they have decided not to run for re-election. They both have contributed to the Co-Op during their time of service. We appreciate all that they contributed to the business of Golf Lakes. The annual meeting requires a lot of work on behalf of the Board, staff and volunteers. Thank you all!

We appreciate all our volunteers, if you have a complaint about any policy set by the Board of Directors, please defer those complaints to the Board or myself. Please do not give our volunteers a hard time and if you are volunteering, please tell anyone complaining to you to contact a Board Member or the Manager.

Board Meetings are normally the second and fourth Thursdays of the month during the season. Until further notice these meetings will be in-person/zoom meetings in the Board Room. The notice of the meeting and the agenda is posted on Tuesday of the week of the meeting by 9 AM on the bulletin board outside the office entrance and on the one in the foyer inside the office entrance door. All Board Meetings are open to all unit owners. An e-blast is sent out 48 hours prior to the meeting containing the zoom information and agenda. If you want to receive the e-blast please be sure the office has your email address.

The accountant should be working on the 2022 financials at this time. It is always good for the office staff to have this process accomplished for another year. Cindy and Judy's great work ethic is seen especially this time of year and your patience during this busy time is appreciated. You will get a postcard notifying you that the review is available. You can then pick the account's report up at the office or request it be e-mailed or mailed to you.

As broker of the Golf Lakes' real estate office; I appreciate the opportunity given to Lynne and myself to represent you in the sale of your home. If there is any way the sales office can be of assistance to you, I hope you will call upon our services.

It is very important that residents report any wet areas you discover in the park to the office so that it can be checked for a water line break. The Association is responsible for all the water lines in the Park except those under your unit. The Association is only responsible for the poles and backboards for the electric to the units. Also, the Association is not responsible for the sanitary sewer going from your unit to the main line.

I would like to encourage all unit owners to take a walk around their units for items that need cleaned, trimmed or repaired.

Do not forget that remotes are no longer needed to exit the park at any gate.

Golf Lakes is posted as a NO SOLICITATION community. Please do not purchase from vendors going door to door in the Park. Tell them there is no soliciting in Golf Lakes and call the office to report them.

Feeding food to the wildlife I know is fun for some. But, please do not encourage wildlife to be fed at your individual units. Please check the bulletin board for information on feeding Canadian Geese and the effects of doing so.

On Thursday, March 23rd and 24th there will be a Spring Clean-Up Day. The garbage collectors will take away all items put out to the curb except for paint and hazardous materials. Everyone needs to have their items to the street by 7:00 AM on the 23rd. There will be no going back to an area for additional pickups. The vendor is hoping to have all the park completed in one day. If not the second day will be used. Please take this opportunity to clean out, especially things stored outside. Outside items need to be stored away, anchored permanently or removed when you depart Golf Lakes for any time longer than 14 days. Year-round residents need to make it as easy as possible to put things away during a storm. Please consider getting rid of items that cannot easily be put inside quickly.

RULE REMINDER

X. VEHICLES, TRAFFIC AND TRAILERS:

Speed limit for all vehicles is fifteen (15) miles per hour.

Universal remote usage entering or exiting any gate is strictly prohibited.

Residents shall park their vehicles on their own driveway and shall not park on the street overnight.

B. VEHICLES, OTHER THAN GOLF CARTS, shall not park on the grass or stone

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Through the Years Cover Story

In the early days, residents had pancake breakfasts and celebrated the holidays together with potlucks and fishing in the lake (see cover photo). As the park grew, special groups and organizations were started and the following is a bit of the early history in the Making of New Friends, Becoming a Golf Lakes Family and Staying Active!

The Red and Black Shuffleboard competition took place on Friday afternoons with the losers treating the winners to coffee and donuts on Saturday morning. This became an official coffee hour for all residents in 1966. The Petticoat Shufflers were then started and, after eight additional courts were added, the official tournaments with other parks began in 1970.

The Women's Club began in 1965 for volunteer and charity work including Head Start in 1970 and making Lap Robes for nursing homes in the 80's. They have received many special service awards throughout the years. In 1966, the women started their Hobby and Bazaar Sale which morphed into a larger "White Elephant Sale" in 1971. In 1966, the Vespers Sunday devotional services started along with Bible Classes during the week. Unfortunately, with growth comes strife, so Lynn Gilmore formed the Residents Association and Kay Bower was the 1st President to help the residents adjust to Golf Lakes Park Life with their new-found friends and neighbors from all over the U.S.

Have you ever heard of the Jolly Loners/Rovers? In 1966 five ladies created what is now known as the Gad A Bouts who wanted to get acquainted with new friends and see different places. In '68 the Star Club was created for Eastern Star Members from their respective hometowns. Ladies Bridge started in '66 and has grown into several other card clubs like Pinochle in '69, Euchre in '74, and more recently Hand & Foot.

The first park-wide entertainment was "The Follies of 1968" in which 100 residents took part and marked the debut of the ladies' Tinphony Band. In '69 the band made its first public appearance in the Cortez Plaza which led to several other local performances. The Singing Men of Golf Lakes graced us in '68 with beautiful music along with the Mellowtones and many piano accompaniments. Ballroom Dancing, Square Dancing/Round Dancing also started in the late 60's. Our "Night of Music" began in 1977 as a way to "show off" the talent in the park. It still is not to be missed!

In 1969 the *Bicycle Club* started and they went on to help construct bike paths outside the park and hold many competitions. *BINGO* began with an electric machine that shot the balls up and used cards to push numbers. We have come a long way since the 60's!

In 1970, the *Men's Golf League* began with an astonishing 120 members who played at various courses until '73 when our Executive Golf Course was built. In '80 the *Ladies Golf League* began. *Ten Pin Bowling* started at Cortez Lanes with eight teams in 1971 and has expanded since then. *Lawn Bowling* began in '76 with the construction of a new court and tournaments started in 1980.

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

Following is a brief description to decide where you feel you would be most comfortable. Once class starts, if you or I feel you don't fit in that particular class we can discuss a change.



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Golf Lakes encourages residents to focus on five basic recycling materials – plastic, metal, glass, cardboard, and paper. The goal is to raise awareness about good recycling habits. Below is a list of troublesome materials that should not be placed in the recycling bins:

- No Styrofoam, plastic bags, plastic hangers, extension cords or garden hoses
- No pots/pans, auto parts, fencing, wire, or metal hangers
- · No wrapping paper, napkins, or paper towels
- No garbage, yard waste, wet or solled cardboard (NO PIZZA BOXES)
- No broken glass, drinking glasses, light bulbs or mirrors

Placing improper items in the recycling bins contaminates the materials making them unrecyclable. Placing items such as plastic bags, extension cords, wire, etc. in the bin contributes to contamination. If the contamination is not identified by Golf Lake's staff prior to arriving at the recycling facility it causes problems such as jamming and damaging sorting equipment. Not only can equipment be damaged but the amount of recycles that can be successfully recovered is reduced.

It is incumbent upon Golf Lakes residents to follow all recycling requirements. If you ever have any questions as to recycling requirements, please contact the office or one of the Green Committee members listed in the directory.

WITHIN GOLF LAKES ESTATES

To provide access for emergency services, 20 feet is commonly accepted as a minimum width for two-way traffic. For perspective, 5th Street East and 8th Street East are 24 feet wide. However, on some cul-de-sacs and streets the width is only 19 feet making navigation difficult for emergency services. This situation is aggravated if you park your vehicle or golf cart on the street. In addition, because of the narrower street and proximity to other's driveways, it makes it difficult for residents to back out of their own driveway.

If possible, use other modes of transportation when visiting others in the park. Walk, bike or use a golf cart, if available. If you must drive a car and park, park in the guest area at the end of cul-de-sacs.

SAFETY AND STOPPING REQUIREMENTS

Greater Manatee County traffic can be daunting at times. This becomes especially true during the school season. Here are the requirements when approaching a stopped school bus:

- The penalty for illegally passing a stopped school bus that is displaying a stop signal is \$200. Illegally passing on the side children enter/exit is \$400.
- ✓ Your license could be suspended for a 2nd violation within a five-year period.
- Your phone must be in hands-free mode when in a school zone. Better yet, put your phone down while navigating traffic. There are enough distractions without having a call or text to complicate matters.
- On a two-lane road, vehicles traveling in both directions must stop.
- On a multi-lane road paved all the way across vehicles traveling in both directions must stop. As an example, this would apply to much of SR 70 (53rd Avenue East) and sections of US 41 (14th Street West).
- On a highway divided by a median, cars traveling in the opposite direction are not required to stop but should proceed with caution.

School zones typically have yellow flashing warning lights and lower speed limits. They can be easily missed on roads such as SR 70 (53rd Street East) so remain alert at all times.

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THE STASSNOT LENT

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.
