Items to remove and store include: flowers pots, grills, decorative statues, outdoor furniture, garbage cans, bicycles and rain barrels. If all items are not stored properly or anchored permanently, at the owner's expense, Golf Lakes will remove the items.

### Becoming a 5-Star Park

### Cover Story

### So are you still wondering how we got our pool???

The Board of Directors contacted state legislators to lobby for change in the summer of 1990. After months of negotiating with the state, the law was changed to "approval by two thirds of the owners". It was finally put to a vote and overwhelmingly approved with only 41 opposing. Even the non-swimmers saw the investment value of raising the park to a "five star" facility rating. The plans for the pool were started once more, with Pinellas Pools Inc. receiving the winning bid for the 40' x 60' heated pool and adjacent Jacuzzi. During this time our new CPA, John Dowd, found a sizable tax error and we received a large refund which enabled us to build a beautiful pool without any resident assessment.

The pool was dedicated on December 6, 1991. Several Golf Lakes ladies performed a synchronized swimming program which amazed everyone in attendance. There was an old-fashioned swim suit parade *(see cover)*, singing, and eating. A great time was had by all. The fitness center was established in that area and the laundry room enlarged. These have proven to be a wonderful addition to our park.

Also, in 1991 we established our Real Estate office in the clubhouse and Barbara James was named our first agent. Sales began to boom as Golf Lakes' reputation grew as one of the most desirable parks in the area.

Unfortunately, Security had become a problem, and for one summer there were numerous break-ins and thefts in the park. Volunteers arranged night patrols of the park and would take two or three hour shifts all night long patrolling the park until a new gate was selected and installed at the 9<sup>th</sup> street entrance to the park. This created a great deal of interest and for many days crowds gathered to watch the gate operate. Board members took shifts standing at the gate showing people how it operated.


During the first five years many traditions were established, committees formed and governing structured to make Golf Lakes as you know it today. It was time to begin changes and renovations which would enhance our park. We had wonderful guidance from our attorney, Mr. Korp, who was and is, one of the foremost authorities on Cooperative Law.


In 1994 the overhaul of the water system began with \$350,000 worth of new 10' line and fire hydrants within 400' of every home.

Another important change in 1994 was our Garbage handling. Originally, we were paying the county of Manatee to come into the park, which was not only very expensive, but the heavy county trucks were doing a great deal of damage to our streets. The Manager proposed purchasing our own trash compactor for \$40,000 and we contracted J&S to pick up the trash saving over \$50,000 the first year and thereafter!

NEW HOME PLACEMENT COMMITTEE REMINDER

One mandate of the New Home Placement Committee is that we are responsible, along with the Park Manager, for determining that modifications to the exterior of existing homes shall comply with the rules as set forth by the Board of Directors. No construction of any new structure or additions to existing structures, or any painting, is to commence prior to submitting drawings and specifications to the Manager and obtaining written approval to proceed with the construction.

Regulations are in place concerning paint colors. Our committee modified the acceptable colors, and these were approved by your Board of Directors earlier this year. If you are planning to repaint, please check to be sure your color is still on the approved list. Samples of approved colors can be obtained in the Golf Lakes Office. More specifics regarding colors can be found in section VII. THE MOBILE HOME of the next issue of the GL directory.

### **RECYCLABLE MATERIALS**



Many glass, cardboard and plastic items can be recycled. Plastic bags and Styrofoam cannot be recycled by Manatee County and should not be placed in the Golf Lakes recycling bins.

The following materials are recyclable in Manatee County (all food and beverage containers should be rinsed):

- Newspapers, Junk Mail, shopping ads, windowed envelopes, magazines and paperback books



### We Need Your Help to Reduce Recycling Contamination

Golf Lakes encourages residents to focus on five basic recycling materials - plastic, metal, glass, cardboard, and paper. The goal is to raise awareness about good recycling habits. Below is a list of troublesome materials that should not be placed in the recycling bins:

- No Styrofoam, plastic bags, plastic hangers, extension cords or garden hoses
- No pots/pans, auto parts, fencing, wire, or metal hangers
- No wrapping paper, napkins, or paper towels
- No garbage, yard waste, wet or soiled cardboard (NO PIZZA BOXES)
- No broken glass, drinking glasses, light bulbs or mirrors

Placing improper items in the recycling bins contaminates the materials making them unrecyclable. Placing items such as plastic bags, extension cords, wire, etc. in the bin contributes to contamination. If the contamination is not identified by Golf Lake's staff prior to arriving at the recycling facility it causes problems such as jamming and damaging sorting equipment. Not only can equipment be damaged but the amount of recycles that can be successfully recovered is reduced.

It is incumbent upon Golf Lakes residents to follow all recycling requirements. If you ever have any questions as to recycling requirements, please contact the office or one of the Green Committee members listed in the directory.




### CRUSH **BEFORE RECYCLING!**
