Progress is Not always a good thing

Ninth Street work will irk residents

An \$8.5 million project to widen two sections of Ninth Street East is scheduled to begin in about three months.

J.W. Branan retired to his longtime home on Ninth Street East, figuring to wile away the time planting shrubs and flowers to spruce up his front lawn.

He didn't foresee that nearly half of his yard would be taken away a few years later for a widening of the street.

"I was fixing it up real nice," Branan said as he stood on his neatly manicured grass. "This kind of took the wind out of it."

Much of Branan's yard work will be tern out when the first phase of an 88.5 million Manatee County project to widen two sections of Ninth Street East begins in about three months.

The first phase covers Ninth Street between U.S. 301 Boulevard and 53rd Avanue West and will cost about \$4.5 million to widen the

Progress is not always a Good Thing Cover Story

In 1995 the County decided to widen 9th Street and used Eminent Domain for the road to encompass part of Golf Lakes. The fence would have to be moved and many trees cut down, so they offered \$116,986 for the 1.7 acre strip of land. The BOD decided to initiate a lawsuit against the County for a better settlement and hired a lawyer. During that time the County moved forward with their plan causing lots of chaos and turmoil. So, three residents decided to record everything that was going on. They called themselves "Frick, Frack and Flick". Due to this turmoil the President started a new motto "We will not get upset" which became the motto during that time with painted posters and some humor. The lawsuit settled in 1996 for \$362,500 for damages securing a win for our Park.

Now that the 9th Street Project was completed it became evident that the increased traffic and noise became intolerable for those living along the fence that was moved closer to them. So, a committee was formed to visit other pars and examine their security walls. Once the BOD decided on what was best for Golf Lakes, the biding started, and the project began in July of 1997. It was dedicated in January of 1998 at a cost of \$500,000 with no assessments to the residents. New home placements skyrocketed.

Other projects during this time still ensued with the expansion of the kitchen, the restrooms moved and enlarged, and the Fitness Center was enlarged and new equipment was added. Our Women's Club donated new appliances and the Shuffleboard Club donated a new microwave. When all was completed it added \$80,000 worth of new comfort and conveniences for us. Also, our own recycling center became operational, and 15 cul-desacs were resurfaced.

During the summer of 1999 the second phase of the huge water system improvement got underway with new pipes, hydrants, and a modernized lift station at a cost of \$210,000. The Beautification committee completed major work around the clubhouse, practice green, and other park areas inside and out. They added 35 Queen Palm Trees along our new 9th street wall. Thank you!

Funny antidotes

During these years we found ourselves with a 'skinny dipper' in the pool and a resident who decided to dig out the bushes around the clubhouse to re-plant them in his own yard.

Of course, these were handled with discretion and not much upheaval.

Now to Celebrate

Golf Lakes celebrated the 10^{th} Anniversary of the cooperative with a Gala in 1997. The clubhouse was turned into a ballroom with silver lined walls, live music, balloons, Hors D'oeuvres, punch, and desserts. Resident dressed in their finest attire and danced through the evening.





IN CASE OF A HURRICANE

AFTER THE STORM

When the 'All Clear' Sounds

Remember that "All Clear" indicates that the emergency or storm is over. It does not mean that you are cleared to return to your home. You need to listen to local authorities for authorization to return to a specific area. The Manatee County Citizen Information Center can be reached at 941-748-4501 for local information and assistance.

After a disaster, you may be without power and many of the services you rely on, including water, sewer, phone, cell phones, businesses, etc. Immediate response may not be possible, so you must be prepared to be self-reliant.

Once you determine that you can go home, gather all your belongings, and clean the shelter area used. <u>BE SURE YOU HAVE YOUR GOLF LAKES MEMBERSHIP CARDS</u> TO GET BACK INTO THE PARK.

Upon Returning

- Consider procurement of needed supplies and food before returning to your home.
- Inform your next of kin of your return home and how you are doing.
- Do not touch loose or dangling electrical wires. If you notice such problems, do not turn the power on and report this condition to proper authorities.
- Do not wade or drive in flood waters.
- Beware of outdoor hazards (snakes, strayed animals, and other critters). Be alert for potholes, sinkholes, structural damage, etc.
- Do not drink County/City tap water until official word comes that it is safe to do so. Use bottled water from the hurricane survival kit or purchase additional water if possible.
- Guard against spoiled food. If there is any doubt, discard. It is better to be on the safe side.
- · Do not "sightsee". This only hampers recovery efforts.
- Report all unsafe conditions to the proper authorities.
- If personal damage to your household goods is encountered, contact your insurance carrier as soon as possible.



Insurance Guidelines

Immediately report property damage to your insurance agent and company.

Your company will issue a special reference number for your claim -- Write it down! Keep this number close by in all your dealings with the company.

Recognize that three different types of adjusters handle claims.

An adjuster often participates in claim, loss or damage settlement. An adjuster must hold a proper license from the Department of Insurance to perform work in Florida. The three kinds of adjusters are:

- Company adjusters, who work as insurance company employees
- Independent adjusters, who usually work as employees of independent adjusting firms which contract with your insurance company to handle claims
- Public adjusters, who do not work for insurance companies or independent adjusting firm. Public adjusters are self-employed, or work in association with a public adjusting firm. Public adjusters contract with the insured to help them settle their claims with insurance companies and are paid by receiving a negotiated percentage of the claims settlement. This means that if you contract with a public adjuster, you must share a portion of your settlement with that public adjuster.

All adjusters are required to adjust your claims strictly in accordance with your insurance contract, and in compliance with the Florida Insurance Code. All adjusters must comply with the "Adjusters Code of Ethics" contained in the Department of Insurance rules. Be sure to see the adjuster's license identification.


Make emergency repairs and document them.

Your policy probably requires you make emergency repairs to prevent further damage to your home or contents. You may need to use plywood or tape to stop rain from entering holes caused by the debris hitting your home. Keep all receipts and take photos of the damage, before and after the repair, to submit with your claim.

Beware of fraud.

Insurance fraud cost Florida families thousands of dollars each year. If you suspect insurance fraud call the Fraud Hotline at 1-800-378-0445.



In the Aftermath

Although the storm has passed, there are many dangers that still exist. Take the proper precautions to prevent further crises. If you have any doubts about safety, err on the side of caution.

Relief supplies and other aid will be arriving as quickly as possible following a major hurricane. Insurance companies will send special disaster teams, as will the state and federal governments and a host of private organizations.

It may take several days, however, for them to arrive at the disaster site. Not only does it take time to gather and load the unique supplies that this area may require, but roadways may be blocked by debris or be unsafe for travel. This is why it is imperative that you have enough food and water supplies available for your family's needs for 3 days.

Safety Concerns

Just because you've survived a hurricane, doesn't mean all the health and safety concerns have passed. Here are some important points to keep in mind.

Health Care: The operation of medical facilities and hospitals may be limited. Stay tuned to your local news team for more medical information.

Food Safety: Food that has not been refrigerated for 2 hours or more, has an unusual odor, color or texture and is no longer cool to the touch is unsafe. When in doubt, throw it out.

Drinking Water:Never assume that public water is safe to drink. Use bottled water for cooking, eating and drinking until there are public announcements about water safety. If bottled water is not available, boil tap water rapidly for at least one minute.

Hand Washing/Sanitation: Wash hands often with soap and clean water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer to decrease the risk of illness.

Mold: Molds are fungi that can be toxic and cause severe reactions in many people. Don't underestimate the health hazards that mold presents.

Mosquitos: Heavy rains and flooding lead to an increase in the mosquitos. Public health authorities recommend you avoid the outdoors from Dusk to Dawn, dress in long pants and long sleeves, use repellent with at least 30% DEET, and dump standing water where mosquitos can lay eggs.

Carbon Monoxide: Do not burn charcoal, gas grills, or gas-powered generators indoors.


