Welcome to August! No big storms and very little rain here. The temperature has been in the mid 90's with high humidity and a heat index of 105 to 110 degrees. It feels like it too !!

Later this month the palm trees will be trimmed. This is done annually in August so the trees will look good for the fall and winter season. The cart path for the bridge is finished. It now has pavers instead of crushed shell, and it looks really nice. It is definitely a big improvement.



The recycling area is a convenience for the residents, but it is not being used properly. Please read the sign on the wall below each bin as to what you may put in that specific bin. Corrugated cardboard does not go in with the newspaper and cereal boxes. Your corrugated boxes should be broken down flat and then placed in the proper bin under the lid. *Plastic bags, big sheets of plastic, egg cartons, Styrofoam, and banding material* <u>do not go in any bin</u>. These items must go with your household trash. Crush your aluminum cans and step on your plastic milk cartons before you put

them in the proper bin. When the bins are taken to the county, they must be covered; please, if the bin is full, take your recycling home with you and bring it back after the bins are emptied. Do not leave it anywhere else in the recycling area. The bins must be closed and covered during transport. **If you, as residents, do not put the articles in the correct bins, the county may not take our recycling bins.** If that happens, everything will then go into the weekly trash and then into our compactor. The compactor would fill up quicker requiring more trips to the landfill at \$800, plus each trip, and that increases your costs. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Nancy and I hope you have a wonderful rest of the summer. Fall is coming and hopefully, it will cool down some.

Those who left items out before leaving have been notified and we appreciate those who have made the necessary arrangements to have all items properly stored.


The Tie-Down Program has started and as mentioned in a recent email blast, they will be extending our park service dates in order to have our "snow birds" back at Golf Lakes to meet and better understand what is needed to prepare units for the program. You can still sign-up by contacting the office for an application.

The annual burnishing of the terrazzo floors in the Clubhouse will begin on August 7. Access may be limited, so please be aware and watch for posted signs regarding entrance points and access.

This year's electrical backboard replacement project includes 46 boards being replaced. Affected owners have already been notified and those with disconnects that cannot be reused will have theirs replaced at their expense. If you did not get a letter, you are not part of this year's area of replacement.

The budgeting process is well underway and will soon be presented to the Finance Committee for evaluation and recommendations to the Board, followed by presenting to the community.

We hope everyone near and far is enjoying their respective summers and we look forward to everyone returning soon.

Cover Story

In the year 2000, many improvements were made to the clubhouse such as a new ceiling, recessed lighting, folding dividers and painting throughout the hall. Permanent poster frames were installed along the wall near the kitchen, bulletin boards were enlarged and an annex was built to house the ceramic kilns.

A major concern of residents around this time was the future of the neighboring Heather Hills Golf Course. The owners had asked the county to change the designation from Recreation-Open Space to Residential. There was the constant threat that we could have a large low-income apartment complex next door and lose a major attraction golf course. There were efforts made at that time for Golf Lakes to buy the golf course which were not successful, and this was not be resolved until several years later.

Six years ahead of schedule, on March 5th 2001, the Golf Lakes Resident's Association paid off the bank loan that completed our 14 million dollar purchase of the park back in 1987. Board officers traveled to the Bank of America to make the Park debt-free. The residents celebrated an amazing accomplishment with Gene Fogarty, Banker, and Harold Todd our Budget and Finance Committee Chairman burned the mortgage during a festive ceremony (pictured on cover). Todd later noted "for all who remembered the intimidation of our first 86,000 monthly mortgage payment in 1987, it was truly a moment to cherish."

In 2002 a grant of \$2,500 was received from Manatee County, which was used for an irrigation system in the niches and the planter on the corner of 9th Street & 53rd Ave. A <u>prestigious award was</u> <u>given by Manatee County</u> to Golf Lakes for the park's *attractive outward appearance and its outstanding recycling system.*

In 2004 a major overhaul of the sewer system was undertaken, the system was getting old and over \$200,000 was spent in its modernization. Also, the completion of the major water system project where more fire hydrants were installed, thus helping our homeowner's insurance premiums. Another \$350,000 worth of 10" pipes were installed and in 2009 shut off valves for enabling sections of the park to be shut down in the event of a water break finished the total project.

The waterwheel, which had become a sentimental landmark, was also reconstructed by several very dedicated volunteers. 2004 also saw record park evacuations during the months because of hurricane warnings, the residents gave a sigh of relief when the hurricane season ended.

In 2005 Golf Lakes was named the <u>Mobile Home Community of the Year</u> by the *Manatee Community Blood Services* for the 3rd consecutive year and that segment of the park received much deserved recognition. A new requirement established mandatory background checks for everyone buying, renting or living in a home in the park. Speeding in the park was also addressed and a new comprised movable sign which would collect the data of the time and date of the speeder was purchased and installed.

The Beautification Committee was a major improvement to the appearance of our park when a new three tiered fountain was installed in front of our clubhouse. This committee has continued to landscape and add beauty to Golf Lakes. Additionally, the entrance gates needed renovation and the system was completely modernized. New electronics were installed and the result was that more than one vehicle with a remote could enter the main gate without waiting for the gate to close.

Safety First



With all of the summer construction and the tie-down crews in the park we still need to pay attention. Please remind your summer visitors about safety issues while they are in Golf Lakes so lets review a few safety rules.

- Walk on the <u>left</u>, facing oncoming traffic.
- Ride bicycles on the <u>right</u>, with vehicular traffic.
- It is important to wear light colored clothing before sunup and after sundown. Inexpensive <u>safety vests</u> are available at the office for additional protection. Carrying a <u>flashlight</u> will also make you more visible.
- Golf cart drivers <u>shall not</u> include anyone under 16 years of age.
- Golf cart drivers need to follow the same traffic rules as cars and trucks.
- Be a good neighbor and leave your yard light on for the summer months. Without lighting some areas can become dark, which encourages criminal activities. Submitted by Joel Pinker



One mandate of the New Home Placement Committee is that we are responsible, along with the Park Manager, for determining that modifications to the exterior of existing homes shall comply with the rules as set forth by the Board of Directors. No construction of any new structure or additions to existing structures, or any painting, is to commence prior to submitting drawings and specifications to the Manager and obtaining written approval to proceed with the construction.

Regulations are in place concerning paint colors. Our committee modified the acceptable colors, and these were approved by your Board of Directors earlier this year. If you are planning to repaint, please check to be sure your color is still on the approved list. Samples of approved colors can be obtained in the Golf Lakes Office. 




