The trash contractor will not pick up any bags with household waste and yard waste mixed. If the yard waste gets into the trash compactor, Golf Lakes can be fined. Clear plastic bags can be purchased in the office. Yard waste bags must be 40 pounds or less, or they will not be picked up.

Hopefully by the first of the month, or a little later, the palm trees will be trimmed. The company we had been using went out of business. We are looking for another tree trimming company.

Despite the extreme heat, lack of rain and being short-handed with maintenance personnel, we have managed to keep things looking good and have made great strides toward completing all of the summer projects.

The new pavers leading to the bridge are complete and it looks like we have found some wonderful resident volunteers to build and install new railings. We will be wrapping up the final segment of the sanitary sewer lateral lining in the next few weeks. The fitness building is being painted; the clubhouse floors are being burnished and polished; the irrigation along 53rd is being repaired, as well as, all rain sensors being inspected and replaced as needed.

We unfortunately learned that our longtime tree trimming vendor, ArborX, has had to close their doors and will not be able to perform the annual tree trimming. We are searching for a replacement vendor but it may take a while to get someone back on the schedule, so please be patient.

The first draft of next year's budget is complete and will be reviewed by the Budget and Finance Committee. The Board will then vote on the Budget in December, after which it will be provided to all residents. The Board will discuss the budget in its entirety at the first Board Meeting in October and again at the Budget Meeting the first Thursday in December.

While the Tie Down Program hit a snag, StormReady will be returning soon to complete their first round through the park. Be sure you get your home ready to receive the tie-downs if you have signed up for the program. Details are still available in the office and it is not too late to sign up.

We look forward to seeing everyone again. Safe travels and see you all soon.

Rule Reminder

VIII. The Mobile Home (Cont)

- 14. Utility Rooms/Sheds must be of conventional construction and must meet all setback requirements and if at all possible, are to be extensions of existing structures.
 - Stand-alone sheds such as Rubbermaid or sheds made of vinyl, plastic or any flexible material are not to be used.
 - Any existing stand-alone sheds/storage units, shall be securely anchored to the ground, as approved by the manager.
 - However; when the property changes hands, the sheds/storage units made of vinyl, plastic, or any flexible material must be removed.

Cover Story

2008 saw much heated discussion over the need for a new clubhouse, so a committee was formed and did a great deal of work recommending plans for a larger clubhouse that would meet the needs of the people for years to come. A resident vote was taken and the decision was not to precede with a new clubhouse. Instead, a new roof was installed later in 2008.

It was also proposed that the existing electric meter backboards be replaced by an underground electrical distribution system in the park. After extensive study and debate this proposal was also defeated by resident vote.

2009 brought to light a major erosion problem at Golf View Lake. After much study and investigation, it was decided to build a retaining wall around three sides of the lake. The water was dropped to allow the contractor to install footers. No worries you avid fisherman! It was never lowered to the point that the fish were endangered. Upon completion of the wall the water level was allowed to return to normal.

Another major project was building a perimeter wall on the West side of the park going north from 53rd and west all the way to the canal. The wall was made of precast panels at a cost of \$245,000.00. It proved to be a major security device as well as a noise deterrent.







During 2010, the fire marshal visited the clubhouse and declared there must be a new voice activated alarm system this would also require new double doors on the South side of the clubhouse. These were installed.

Another major development was the sale of Heather Hills Golf Course which had been a source of concern for many years. The prospect of a low income housing complex being developed on the land was one that would lower the value of our Golf Lakes Estates. So on January 1, 2010, a privately formed corporation made up of charter members from the surrounding communities of Heather Hills, El Rancho Village and Golf Lakes purchased the course. There were 156 Charter Members who contributed around \$5,000 each, some were able to help more and some less, to the acquisition effort. Exactly half of those members were from Golf Lakes with John Bauman being a major factor in making this a reality. The \$800,000.00 raised enabled them to acquire financing and on May 25th the closing guaranteed the continued existence of the golf course. The purchase price was \$1,150,000.00. The course is now called The Greens of Manatee.

Key points to remember about hot weather safety



We are not as young as we used to be, so we all have a tougher time dealing with the heat and humidity. The temperature inside or outside does not have to be high to put you at risk for a heat-related illness. Headache,

confusion, dizziness, or nausea could be a sign of a heat-related illness. Go to the doctor or to an emergency room to find out if you need treatment.

To keep heat-related illnesses from becoming a dangerous heat stroke, remember to:

- Get out of the sun and into a cool, ideally airconditioned place.
- Drink fluids but avoid alcohol and caffeine.
- Shower, bathe, or sponge off with cool water.
- Lie down and rest.



One mandate of the New Home Placement Committee is that we are responsible, along with the Park Manager, for determining that modifications to the exterior of existing homes shall comply with the rules as set forth by the Board of Directors. No construction of any new structure or additions to existing structures, or any painting, is to commence prior to submitting drawings and specifications to the Manager and obtaining written approval to proceed with the construction.

Regulations are in place concerning paint colors. Our committee modified the acceptable colors, and these were approved by your Board of Directors earlier this year. If you are planning to repaint, please check to be sure your color is still on the approved list. Samples of approved colors can be obtained in the Golf Lakes Office. 


Social Hour Short Announcements



Having the first Monday in September off from work was significant for American workers in 1894, when Labor Day was declared a national holiday. Working conditions in the country's factories, railroads, mills, and mines were grim. Employees, including many children, were often required to work 12 hours a day, six days a week, in crowded, poorly ventilated spaces. Supervision was harsh and punishments were handed out to those who talked or sang as they worked.

Calls for shorter workdays and better conditions came from worker strikes and rallies in the decades after the Civil War. On Sept. 5, 1882, union leaders in New York City organized what's thought to be the first Labor Day parade. Tens of thousands of labor union members—bricklayers, jewelers, typographers, dress and cloak makers, and many other tradespeople—took unpaid leave and marched with their locals. The day culminated in picnics, speeches, fireworks, and dancing.

Labor Day had become an official holiday in 24 states by the time it became a federal holiday. Labor Day parades and other festivities demonstrate the strength and esprit de corps of trade and labor organizations. They celebrate workers' contributions to the country's strength, prosperity, and well-being.

1. BAGGAGE FEES


