



It is good to have most everyone back at Golf Lakes. Remember to do a full inspection of your property and take care of any needed maintenance such as cleaning or painting your siding and awnings, cleaning dirty border material, and address any needed landscape maintenance.

Report

While the Tie-Down Program stalled over the summer due to Storm Ready staffing issues, they are planning to host another meeting with Golf Lakes residents to answer all remaining questions before restarting in the park. We will post notice once they have provided us a day and time for the meeting.

Hopefully everyone has turned in their Lawn Maintenance contracts with Arbor Landscape. They were due November 1. Please remember if you have elected for Arbor Landscape to take care of your lawn; per the contract, you are responsible to protect your siding, air conditioners and any wires from damage.

The first communication meeting is scheduled for Monday, November 6th. Please plan to attend all of these meetings which are held the first Monday of every month, November through April at 7 p.m. These meetings provide information about the business of the Association.

The proposed 2024 Budget has been distributed to residents. Mark your calendars for the Budget and Communication Meeting, Monday, December 4th at 7:00 p.m. The proposed 2024 Budget will be reviewed and adopted at this meeting, please bring your copy of the budget with you.

Reminder: Garbage must be out by 7:30 a.m. Tuesday and Friday. Trash has to be in bags and must weight no more than 40 pounds. If your trash is not picked up, it may mean it is not acceptable for pick up based on weight or size.

Non-household trash requires a special pick up and landfill dump. The cost is based on a per piece charge; contact the office for pricing and payment. These special pick-ups are the third Tuesday of every month. You need to schedule and pay at the office prior to pick up day.

Yard Waste is collected on normal trash days but MUST be placed in *clear* yard trash bags and weigh no more than 40 pounds. Bags are available for sale in the office for \$1.50 per dozen. The use of clear bags identifies it as yard trash, which cannot be placed in the compactor.

Building materials and/or yard waste is not allowed in the barn and recycling area. Contractors must remove all debris and waste when they are hired to work in the park.

Please recycle responsibly and understand which items are acceptable. Avoid recycling during weekends by recycling Monday through Thursday, so that the bins do not overflow during the weekend. The maintenance staff and volunteers should not have to sort unacceptable items out of the recycling bins.

The office will be closed Thursday and Friday, November 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> for the Thanksgiving Holiday. Happy Thanksgiving to all of our residents.

Final reminder: No pets may visit with unit owners. If your guest requires an animal due to a disability, they must be approved in advance to bring into the Park.

### Weathering the Storms Together only Make us Stronger !

Cover Story

2015 started off with the decision to replace our covered bridge. Too many people were wanting to drive their golf carts across it, and it was just not stable enough. So before someone fell off into the lake, we decided to re-do it stronger and better!

After that, we worked on updating and replacing our many park street signs and worked on the pipe lining of our sewer lines.

July 2016 brought "Colin" a small tropical storm which caused minimal damage, but then in August, 2016 Category 1, Hurricane "Hermine", decided to visit us with 10" - 20" of rainfall and significant clean-up.

In November the Board decided to move an entrance gate on 9<sup>th</sup> street and create a brick privacy wall for the residents at the entrance. Not only for safety in case someone accidentally drive into the home facing the gate, but it helped block all of our vehicle lights at night.

Spring blossomed again, and in April of 2017 new lanterns were installed on the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Gate St. pillars for safety and better visibility of the entrance. In May of 2017 the Lawn Bowling courts were in desperate need of re-surfacing, so all new carpet was installed, and just in time....

Just when we thought the last year of storms were behind us, we found out we were wrong. In July of 2017 Tropical Storm "Emily" made land fall, and then in September, Category 4 Hurricane "Irma", hit us with over 5" of rain and sever winds, causing even more damage. But we were not discouraged, our Golf Lakes Family grew stronger than ever, as we helped each other cleanup the debris, and supported each other demotionally through this difficult time.

Later in the year we added a garden and drainage to the new brick retaining wall at the 9<sup>th</sup> street entrance which completed the project.

During 2018 we were blessed with a calm year to recuperate and enjoy some peace and quite. Besides the yearly maintenance projects.

Security was the focus of 2019 with gate cameras installed at all gates and the barn. A keyless entry system we currently use today was installed, along with the call box replacement.



- 3. Spray a heavy griddle with nonstick spray and heat griddle over medium heat. Spoon 2 tablespoons of batter onto griddle to form each pancake. Cook for 2 minutes or until bubbles appear, then turn pancakes over and cook for 2 minutes longer. Transfer pancakes to plates. Top with butter and serve with warm pecan syrup.




