

checking the total number In VOLUNTEERS on various committees, I came up with approximately 110 and that does not include the Board of Directors (9) or special BOD appointments (12), heads of various clubs and organizations (50), special Activities Committee appointments (20), and all the ladies who hold positions with the Women's Club (15). That's a whopping total of approximately 215 volunteers with their names on paper - probably not even a quarter of our residents when you consider that a number of our volunteers are on two or more committees!

Terry Keller tells me that, including himself, there are only a total of 12 on the Activities Committee. He currently has one vacancy. With 22 events during the year, that means that committee members must do double-duty as far as heading events. However, with the Welcome Back Picnic in November there were jobs for all of the committee members from planning, set-up, cooking, and everything in between, before, and after. And, I have a feeling that there were volunteer volunteers (dessert bakers for one) working that event as well. I don't think it would be an exaggeration to say there were about 45 volunteers involved in that picnic.

But, that is only one of the 22 events that Activities hosts throughout the year. Hour is only included as one event even though it is held weekly!

Then, there are the major holidays - Memorial July 4th, Labor Day, Halloween, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter – and all they involve, plus Potluck Dinners, the Health Fair, the Flea Market, and the Sports Mixer. Got an idea yet as to how busy those 12 volunteers are?

Maybe you don't participate in every one of those activities but I'm sure you participate in a few and enjoy yourself in the process. Without the Activities Committee you eliminate all of your fun!

RECYCLABLE MATERIALS



Many glass, cardboard and plastic items can be recycled. Plastic bags and Styrofoam cannot be recycled by Manatee County and should not be placed in the Golf Lakes recycling bins.

The following materials are recyclable in Manatee County (all food and beverage containers should be rinsed):

- Newspapers, Junk Mail, shopping ads, windowed envelopes, magazines and paperback books
- Office and computer paper (all colors) not shredded
- Phonebooks, greeting cards, brown paper bags
- Non-corrugated card stock (cereal, crackers, frozen food and soda boxes) broken down
- Corrugated Cardboard (must be broken down and placed in the recycle bin.)
- Glass bottles and jars (all colors)
- Aluminum and steel cans (soup and vegetable)
- Plastic bottles (with or without caps) and containers
- Milk, water and juice cartons
