

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BEAUTIFICATION

Takes some hard work and a lot of patience!

Getting to Know the Golf Lakes Landscake - Submitted by Steve Pandiscio, Co-chair Beautification Committee

I have met some nice residents who recently moved into our park, and they have mentioned that one of the main reasons they chose to live here was due to the beautiful landscaping, manicured yards and well-maintained homes. I thought it would be helpful to share how the Beautification Committee participates in helping to keep the park looking great.

The Golf Lakes Beautification Committee takes on many roles. As an extension of the Board of Directors, our main purpose is to monitor the general beautification of all common outdoor grounds of the park, make suggestions for improvements and help implement approved projects.

Our busiest time of the season begins in early November with the launch of our official "planting day." To make this happen, we order over 350 plants from Orban's Wholesale Nursery in early spring, and upon delivery, use them for landscaping the gardens around the clubhouse and gate areas.

Elaine Pittman, Margie Capuci, Lori Mathos and Ari Mathos helped to plant the gardens at the clubhouse.



Flowers are also used to fill the pots we put at the roadside benches. We are fortunate to have several "friends of the committee" who help us get the job done. You will see team members watering the pots every week from November to May. We also sell plants that residents can purchase for their own yards, which helps support the Beautification Committee's budget.

The team spends countless hours weeding and trimming plants in the various gardens throughout the year, even during the humid and hot summers.

Every six months we launch our "palm tree fertilizing project." There are over 1,000 palm trees in our park that we fertilize to keep them as healthy as possible. This program also allows us to keep an eye out for diseases

that could be harming them. Again, we thank the "friends of the committee" for their assistance.

In December we launch our "holiday decorating days." This project includes stringing over 1,500 LED lights around the Welcome and Pelican lakes, hanging wreaths at the clubhouse, entrance gates and welcome wall, putting up the nativity scene, carolers and Christmas tree displays at the clubhouse, and much more. We offer light kits that residents can purchase for their lamp posts.

The committee has been involved in making upgrades to park amenities, such as planning and overseeing the construction of the South Picnic area and designing the plans for the Veterans' Garden project.

These are just some of the duties that the Beautification Committee undertakes. There have been many great projects implemented over the years by talented former members of the committee. Hats off to them!

We appreciate the many compliments we receive from residents and guests. If you have a green thumb, can do vigorous work and enjoy the outdoors, consider joining our committee and help us in keeping Golf Lakes a beautiful place to live.

Even if you can't do strenuous work and spend time bending and stooping, we can still use your help. Your monetary donations are always needed whether for plants, planting supplies, holiday decoration refresh supplies, palm fertilizer, etc. In addition, you will see our notice elsewhere in this issue of The Banner regarding donations for the proposed new Veterans' Gardens to be located in front of the Clubhouse.



There are lots of new things happening on Fridays, so stay tuned.



This committee oversees all improvements or changes made to the **exterior of all homes and lots** in the park. This is **not** just for new homes. Please note the following if you plan on making any changes to the exterior of your home, landscaping or any other structures on your property.

The committee is responsible for reviewing all requests which are received for the following:

- Exterior painting, including driveways, doors, trim, awnings, shutters, etc. Approved color palettes are available in the office.
- Additions, any additions/changes to sheds, porches, lanais, screened-in areas, or the home itself.
- Landscaping, edging, pavers, concrete, planters, adding or removing trees and shrubs.
- Any change to homes such as additional windows, doors, including changes in size or location.
- All placement requirements for new homes including size, lot placement, plumbing and electrical requirements as stated in the governing documents.

The above is not a complete list, but should be used as a reminder that all modifications require prior approval. Applications are available at the office and must be filed, checked and approved before any work is started.

If you intend to do any exterior changes, repairs, additions, improvements always check at the office to see if approval is required.
