The ANNUAL MEETING takes so many hands to prepare, collect, and count proxies and ballots. Thank you to everyone who pitched in to help in this effort. I was so impressed with the responsiveness of residents to ensure that proxies were turned in and we had no issues meeting quorum. This is huge because often communities struggle to get proxies and ballots back from members. Thank you all for being part of the process.

I also want to thank Fran Spraetz and Patti Hegdal who have volunteered to take over as EDITORS for The Banner. Carolyn Boyle, thank you for keeping things afloat in the interim.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE - As our seasonal residents and fulltime residents alike start to think about the approaching close of the season, please perform a full inspection of your home and property and ensure that everything is in order, especially if you will be returning to your summer home.

Check that your home's exterior is clean, including any awnings/shutters that are generally lowered upon departure. If your home exterior needs painting, apply and arrange for that now in order to complete prior to your departure. Your yard should be free of weeds, beds edged and weed free, yard or exterior decorations should be in good repair, clean and tidy. (Décor must be removed prior to your leaving the park for more than seven (7) days.)

If your roof is dirty, arrange to have it cleaned. Clean any screening, lattice, or vertical surfaces of pollen and dirt. Remember to store portable items out of view from neighbors when not in use. There should be no visible storage of materials such as stones/pavers or items no longer used.

Golf Lakes is a highly desirable community to live in, because of its beauty and well-kept grounds. Also, if you leave for the season, remember you must leave your yard light on. Using an LED bulb will only cost you a couple of dollars for the entire time you're gone. If you have any questions, please contact the office for assistance.

PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS – Remember ALL exterior improvements must be approved prior to the work. Applications are available at the office. Improvements installed without permission may result in fines levied against owners.

CLUBHOUSE KITCHEN – Due to some recent damages sustained in the kitchen to our ice machine, we are finding it necessary to lock the kitchen moving forward. We regret any inconvenience to residents; however, in order to preserve the integrity of the commercial licensing and the recent costs to make repairs due to damages caused by improper use, we feel this step is prudent. Keys will be available and managed by the Chairman of Activities, the Kitchen Manager and the office. If you need to arrange for access, please contact the appropriate person from the above list.

NO SPRING CLEAN-UP DAY – Due to rising costs there will be no pick-up of unwanted items this year. If you have bulk items that need to be disposed, you can call the office and arrange for those to be removed by Arbor Landscape for a fee.

Let's all work together to keep Golf Lakes beautiful.

(Sloppy Joes, Chips, Cookies and a drink)


Noon Door prizes & Awards


As you are reading this, our Cruise is past and we ALL had a great time.


SOCIAL HOUR SHORT ANNOUNCEMENTS




