

Nature Sites

De Soto National Memorial—Historical site that commemorates the 1539 landing of Spanish Conquistador Hernando de Soto. Walk the scenic walking trails leading to water views of Manatee River and Tampa Bay. Along the trails are plaques and markers telling the story of De Soto and the indigenous people that inhabited the area. Informative Park rangers in the visitor center and along the trails. There are benches and tables to relax and enjoy the views.

Robinson Preserve—Former agricultural land that has been transformed into a thriving coastal wetland habitat. You can walk or bike coastal trails on a 2.5-mile paved trail or hike 5 miles of wetland trails. There is a free 1-hour tram tour available. To reserve a seat, go to Manatee County website for information. Kayaking is allowed in mangrove tunnels and marshes. Bring a kayak, or book a solo rental or a guided tour. Go to Florida Blue Adventures website for information about rentals.

Perico Preserve—Transformed land into scenic coastal wetlands. This is the first preserve designed as a bird sanctuary. The small trail leads you to enjoy native plants and an abundance of birds and wildlife. An easy trail that loops around tidal areas. For longer hiking the trail can lead you into connecting Robinson Preserve.

Tom Bennett Park—200-acre park with recreational and conservation activities for adults and children. A 1.2-mile asphalt trail winds around marshes and ponds where 177 species of birds have been recorded. A canoe/kayak launch to access mangrove wetlands and scenic Manatee River. A fishing pier is available and is great for birdwatching.

Fun Locations

Pop Stroke Mini Golf—Two 18 hole putting courses easy or challenging. Designed by Tiger Woods. Full restaurant and outdoor dining with scatterings of fun games to play. Rooftop bar and on course service for drinks. Ice cream bar.

Freedom Factory—Abandoned Desoto Speedway transformed into a destination for motorcross enthusiasts. Events are held throughout the year. Fast times with fast cars.

Riverside Tours—Located in Palmetto are guided tours where you and guests can bring your own food and drink. They do pub crawls, beach runs, and sunset cruises. You can request music and have dancing on the boat.

Gulf Island Ferry—An easy and scenic way to travel between Bradenton and Anna Maria Island. Two pontoon boats can carry 48 people on each and they run Friday through Sunday, 10am to 9pm .You can start in downtown Bradenton and go to AMI Pier or get off at Bradenton Beach pier. Any of these stops will give you plenty of places to visit for shopping or getting a bite to eat or just enjoy the beach. Best to reserve seating on line.

A BIT OF FATHERS DAY HISTORY

Father's Day unfortunately was not deemed as an important event like Mother's Day. Men thought the idea as feminine and commercial. The challenges to make it a national holiday took 58 years from the time Mother's Day was declared.

On July 5, 1908, a West Virginia Church held a sermon proposed by patron Grace Golden Clayton to honor 362 men, many being fathers who died in a local coal mining accident. The following year Sonora Smart Dodd started campaigning to have a national holiday for fathers. She lobbied Washington State government and many organizations to support her idea and on June 19, 1910, the first Statewide celebration in Spokane Washington was held with the sponsoring from the local YMCA.

In New York, a pro parent group rallied on many Mother's Days to end the two holidays and wanted one day designated to both parents, giving both parents equal love and respect.

During the Great Depression with retailers hurting stores started marketing the sale of gifts such as neck ties, pipes, and sporting goods as a way for the consumer to show respect and love to their fathers.

During WW2, Father's Day became a way to support the war effort and by the end of the war people considered Father's Day a national holiday.

In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge recognized Father's Day and in 1966 Lyndon B Johnson issued a proclamation. Father's Day never became a national holiday until 1972 when President Richard Nixon, during his re-election campaign, signed a proclamation making Father's Day a national holiday.

There are many traditions and customs families followed, one being the wearing of roses: red roses to honor living fathers and white roses to honor those who have passed away. Families gather at cemeteries putting flowers on the graves of their loved ones.

We continue to make history where we not only honor maternal fathers, but also special individuals who have made a successful impact on someone's life.



June Solstice: Shortest and Longest Day of the Year

There are two solstices every year: one in June and one in December. The June solstice marks the longest day north of the equator and the shortest day in the south.



The June solstice is the moment the Sun is directly above the <u>Tropic of Cancer</u> in the <u>Northern Hemisphere</u>. This is the northernmost latitude it reaches during the year. After the solstice, it begins moving south again.

Longest Day in the North. Since the Northern Hemisphere is tilted toward the Sun in June, it receives more sunlight during the course of a day. The North Pole's tilt toward the Sun is greatest at the solstice, so this event marks the longest day of the year north of the equator.

This effect is greatest in locations that are farther away from the equator. In tropical areas, the longest day is just a little longer than 12 hours; in the temperate zone, it is significantly longer; and places within the Arctic Circle experience Midnight Sun or polar day, when the Sun does not set at night.

Shortest Day in the South. Conversely, the day of the June solstice is the shortest day of the year in the Southern Hemisphere. Here, too, the effect is greater the farther a location is away from the equator. Places within the Antarctic Circle experience <u>polar night</u>, when the Sun does not rise at all.

Why Is It Called a "Solstice?" During a year, the subsolar point—the spot on the Earth's surface directly beneath the Sun—slowly moves along a north-south axis. Having reached its southernmost point at the December solstice, it stops and starts moving northward until it crosses the equator on the day of the March equinox. At the June solstice, which marks the northernmost point of its journey, it stops again to start its journey back toward the south. This is how the solstices got their name: the term comes from the Latin words *sol* and *sistere*, meaning "Sun" and "to stand still".

Initially, the naming arose from observations of how the Sun's apparent path across the sky changes slightly from one day to the next, which is caused by the same process as the subsolar point's movement described above.

In the months leading up to the June solstice, the position of sunrise and sunset creeps northward. On the day of the solstice, it reaches its northernmost point. After that, the daily path of the Sun across the sky begins to creep southward again.






