



**Thanksgiving**, an annual holiday celebrated primarily in the United States and Canada, has its roots in both religious and cultural traditions. It is a day dedicated to expressing gratitude for the harvest and blessings of the past year. While it is now marked by feasting, family gatherings, and parades, Thanksgiving's history is deeply intertwined with the early history of the North American continent.



The origins of Thanksgiving in the United States can be traced back to the early 17th century. In 1620, a group of English Pilgrims, seeking religious freedom, embarked on a perilous journey across the Atlantic Ocean on the Mayflower. After a treacherous 66-day voyage, they landed at what is now Plymouth, Massachusetts. The first winter was brutal, with many of the settlers succumbing to disease, starvation, and exposure.

By the following spring, the surviving Pilgrims were aided by the local Wampanoag people, particularly a Patuxet Native American named Squanto. Squanto taught the Pilgrims essential survival skills, such as how to cultivate corn, extract sap from maple trees, catch fish, and avoid poisonous plants. Thanks to this newfound knowledge, the Pilgrims enjoyed a successful harvest in the autumn of 1621.

In gratitude for the Wampanoag's assistance and the bountiful harvest, the Pilgrims organized a feast in November 1621, which is often referred to as the "First Thanksgiving." This three-day event was attended by 53 Pilgrims and 90 Native Americans, including Chief Massasoit of the Wampanoag tribe. While the exact menu of this feast is not known, it likely included a variety of fowl, venison, seafood, and native fruits and vegetables. However, it is important to note that this feast was not initially intended as an annual tradition but was instead a singular celebration of survival and cooperation.

For the next several decades, Thanksgiving was not celebrated as a national holiday. Rather, various colonies and communities held occasional days of thanks, usually in response to specific events such as military victories, droughts, or bountiful harvests. It wasn't until the late 18th century that the idea of a national Thanksgiving began to take shape.

During the American Revolutionary War, the Continental Congress issued several proclamations calling for days of thanksgiving and prayer. However, it was President George Washington who, in 1789, issued the first national Thanksgiving proclamation. Washington declared November 26 a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, asking Americans to give thanks for the conclusion of the war and the establishment of the U.S. Constitution. Despite this, Thanksgiving remained an irregular observance, with dates varying from state to state.

The establishment of Thanksgiving as a fixed annual holiday is largely credited to Sarah Josepha Hale, an influential magazine editor and writer. For over 30 years, Hale lobbied presidents and governors to establish a national Thanksgiving holiday. Her efforts were finally successful in 1863 when President Abraham Lincoln, seeking to unify the nation during the Civil War, proclaimed the last Thursday in November as a National Day of Thanksgiving.

In 1941, President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed a bill officially making the fourth Thursday in November the national Thanksgiving holiday. This decision was partly motivated by economic concerns, as it extended the holiday shopping season, providing a boost to retailers during the Great Depression.

Today, Thanksgiving is celebrated with various traditions, including a bountiful meal featuring turkey, stuffing, and pumpkin pie, among other dishes. It remains a time for Americans to reflect on their blessings and to come together with family and friends, continuing a legacy of gratitude that has evolved over centuries.

#### **UNDERSTANDING THE SAFETY & GATE COMMITTEE**

The Safety committee exists to monitor the safety of our community.

The operation of the Park's gates is a thankless job. When everything works properly, no one thinks about their operation. BUT, when a problem occurs, people are quick to notice and often complain. Much of the time, when a gate malfunctions, the vendor needs to come on-site, diagnose the problem, and facilitate the repair as quickly as possible. An unfortunate aspect of the gates is the repairs because someone has hit the gate. While infrequent, it is entirely preventable. There are occasions when gates must be kept open.

Many Golf Lakes residents like to walk for exercise. The Safety Committee wants you to know that Walkers should always "face traffic". Too many drivers are distracted and your best defense against injury is seeing the on-coming vehicles. Reflective vests are very important, day or night. The safety vests are available to new members who receive a coupon to redeem for vest in their closing/welcome package.

It is the Safety Committee's goal to work with the residents on any safety concerns that they may have. The committee cannot stress enough that when residents see someone or something that is suspicious **a call should be made** <u>immediately</u> to **911**. Please DO NOT call the office or a board member. The Sheriff Department knows better the chance of catching a problem.

Another component of the Safety Committee is the monthly presentations in the Club House. These are most often on a Monday evening. The programs discussed at these events center on a specific topic and highly informative. The monthly Safety Presentation is announced via signs posted at the entrances of the park. Presenters are professionals in their topic and offer expert advice. The annual Sever Weather/Hurricane presentation changes each year as new or different practices are encouraged. #### HOW TO WORK THE CALL BOX SYSTEM

#### **AFTER THE GATE IS CLOSED**

- 1 The first thing you will need to do is give the office your phone number in order to receive your 4 digit code. All US and Canadian cell phone numbers may be used as well as landlines
- 2 Instruct your guest to pull close to the call box so inbound traffic can pass by them.
- 3 Be sure to tell your guests NOT to follow another car through the gate. The gate only allows for one car at a time.
- 4 At the call box:

If you give your guest the four digit code, they can enter the code and press the call button. When you receive the call, press the number 9 on your phone to open the gate and hangup.

Your guest can also scroll up or down arrow to find the residents' name. They can make it scroll faster by holding down the arrow. Once they find your name, they press the call button. When you receive the call press the number 9 on your phone to open the gate and hangup.




